- Represented leading companies in the global offshore oil and gas industry, including the International Marine Contractors Association (“IMCA”), to reverse a major policy change proposed in the waning days of the Obama administration to significantly expand “Jones Act” nationality restrictions to offshore energy maintenance, construction, and repair activities.
- Represented Furie Operating Alaska (formerly Escopeta), a leading offshore oil and gas exploration and production company, in the largest Jones Act enforcement matter in CBP history. This high-profile case, spanning over five years, settled favorably in April 2017, with oil and gas company Furie paying a record fine, but saving millions in comparison to the original penalties assessed for regulatory violations after it transported a drilling rig from Texas to Alaska.
